

## **Head of School UPDATE**

Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2023

Dear parents/carers and students,

It is hard to forget the soaring heat last July when the temperature reached a staggering 40°C which resulted in many schools across the country having to close. Although it wasn't quite as hot this week, it was still very warm! Despite the heat, our students kept cool by optimising the shaded areas during social times and keeping hydrated. Our students remained sensible during the heatwave and chose to apply suncream and to wear a hat as added protection. Student welfare is always of paramount importance and the relaxed uniform this week enabled our students to remain comfortable whilst at school. The communication from Mrs Conley earlier this week, informed parents and carers of all four Trust schools the measures to support students in this very warm period. One of the House Competitions running in this final term is based on an exciting science-themed project entitled 'Lift Off!' For this competition, students were required to design and build a 'rocket' utilising basic materials, such as, paper, Sellotape and Blu Tack. Students were expected to be creative and to draw upon their scientific knowledge in order for their rocket to travel the furthest, optimising a creative and innovative design. This competition took place at lunchtime over the past three days where students in Years 7-10 could participate with their peers in their respective tutor groups. This initiative was led by Miss Lake (Head of Mays House) and supported by Dr Poulter from the Science department. Miss Lake said "It was overwhelming to see the sheer number



of rockets which were produced since we returned after half term. We had rockets flying over varying distances which was impressive to see. It was great that many students were using their scientific knowledge to enhance their rocket launch."
