UPDATE

Dear parents/carers and students,

Where has this term gone? I cannot believe we only have one week left of Term 3! It has been incredibly busy this week at school.

We have had over 100 Year 11 prefects this academic year. Students wear their prefect tie and badges with pride and support the school community throughout the school day. As our Year 11 students move closer to their examinations, we would like them to focus their attention on those important GCSE and BTECs grades. Next week, we will hold their final prefect breakfast reward. I would like to thank our students for their hard work and dedication over the past year, they have been incredible! I know they will miss their free reward breakfasts too. Mrs Crowson led a special assembly where over 50 of our Year 10 students were newly appointed as Temporary Prefects. These students had to apply through a formal process and were selected based on their excellent attendance and positive attitudes to learning. I look forward to working with our new prefects.

On Thursday, we ran our popular DEAR Time sessions for Year 7 to 10, which stands for 'Drop Everything And Read'. This is where the whole class take turns to read a text and they then discuss what they have read to highlight key vocabulary and share their thoughts on the issues raised in the material. All classes focus on a different subject area so if they normally have an art, history or maths lesson, their reading text will be relevant to art, history, or maths. At Bourne Academy, we value reading as an enriching activity, which can make a profound difference to our students' lives. As well as this, we appreciate that regular reading is linked to a developing vocabulary and improved skills in writing and that both of these skills are vital to success in all curriculum areas and life beyond school.



On Wednesday, we held our first Kin-Ball Primary School event. Several of our amazing Year 10 Sports Leaders supported this primary school sports transition event. We had five different local primary schools bring around ten to fifteen students to participate in the competition. The event was an amazing success. It was great to see so many primary students at Bourne Academy, working with our great student leaders.

Year 11 are now working towards their forthcoming examinations and it has been a positive week for attending lunchtime interventions sessions which we provide every day. We continue to encourage completing GCSEPod revision and using the revision resources we have provided. To encourage further for Year 11 students, we have launched the Loyalty Card which students will get signed every time they attend a revision class. There is plenty of prizes to be won!

To keep students and parents/carers informed about the progress they are making across a Key Stage, reporting plays an essential role in education. Our school aims to provide parents and carers with a reporting system which is informative, frequent and clearly highlights the progress our students are making. Prior to any report being published the information undergoes a rigorous layered quality assurance process to ensure that all reports are accurate and well presented. There are two main types of report; Assessment of Learning and annual written reports.

- Assessment of Learning Data reports (AOL Data) is published three times a year timed to coincide with key events in the academic calendar so that Parents/Carers have the latest information on hand for Parents' Evenings or an accurate summary of grades achieved following Mock exams in Key Stage 4 or 5. The colour contained within these AOL Data reports makes them extremely user friendly, clearly highlighting each student's strengths and weaknesses. As each set of AOL data is added to these reports a picture of progress emerges from comparing grades from each of the 3 data points.
- Written subject reports primarily focus upon specific targets for students to improve upon in each subject. These are published annually in accordance with Department for Education guidelines between December and May (at different times for different year groups) specifically so that staff and students have time in the remainder of the academic year to act upon this advice in subsequent lessons in order to make difference in their studies.


