Dear parents/carers and students,

We've had yet another busy and exciting week at Bourne Academy!

Starting with a bang over the weekend, The Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award expedition in the Rutland area was a resounding success. Students from the four SLAT schools took part and completed the challenge with determination and teamwork. Despite a few navigation hiccups, they showed incredible resilience, pushing through the tougher moments with grit and positivity. The weather added to the challenge, with heavy rain on Sunday morning, but spirits remained high as students adapted to the conditions. By the end of the trip, all participants had successfully passed the expedition, demonstrating their commitment to the DofE ethos. More than just reaching the finish line, the experience was about building character and forming lasting memories with peers from across the Trust.

On Thursday, we celebrated National Poetry Day. Every lesson began with a poem linked to the subject being studied, sparking thoughtful discussions and creative activities around the poem's choice, context, and meaning. It was a wonderful opportunity to explore poetry in a cross-curricular way. 
