Dear parents/carers and students,

It's been another brilliant week here at Bourne Academy. Our Year 7 students have now fully transitioned into secondary school life, and I want to take a moment to praise how smoothly and confidently they've settled in. This achievement reflects the fantastic collaboration between our committed staff, supportive families and eager students.

Our transition programme has been very well received, offering a supportive start for our Year 7 students through initiatives such as Show My Homework, wellbeing workshops, and introductory PSHE and careers sessions. Students have embraced their new routines with enthusiasm, and we're already seeing encouraging levels of academic engagement. Their curiosity and positive attitude in lessons across all subjects are helping to build a strong foundation for future success.

As part of this transition, we were delighted to welcome over 130 Year 7 students and their families to our Reading Evening on Wednesday. The event introduced parents to our reading programme, including how we use the Bedrock website and the school Library to support literacy development. It was a fantastic opportunity to strengthen the partnership between home and school in nurturing a love of reading.







In addition, as part of our ongoing literacy and communication strategy, students in Years 7 to 10 and Year 12 took part in DEAR Time (Drop Everything and Read) during Period 1 on Thursday. Students spend around 10 to 15 minutes exploring captivating reading materials and engaging in fun, thought-provoking activities, linked to the subject that spark imagination and boost literacy skills.

Our Year 13 History students took part in a powerful and insightful visit to the National Holocaust Centre and Museum in Newark. The experience offered a deep and moving exploration of the Holocaust, encouraging students to reflect on vital themes such as tolerance, human rights, and the importance of remembrance. Through survivor testimonies, interactive exhibits, and expert-led sessions, students gained a richer understanding of this significant period in history - directly supporting their coursework and deepening their analytical skills.

This week also marked the exciting launch of our Aspire Passport for students in Years 7 to 10. During a dedicated assembly, students received their passports so they can begin working towards a range of challenges designed to earn bronze, silver or gold awards. Many have already started ticking off bronze-level tasks, some of which can be signed off by parents or carers. We're looking forward to celebrating the achievements and skills they develop through this initiative. A big thank you to all the parents and carers who filled the school hall for our How to Succeed at GCSE evening on Thursday. The event was a great opportunity to share practical advice on revision planning, home support and useful online resources. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive and we are excited to see our Year 10 students beginning to put these strategies into action.

Earlier this week, we announced that we are holding a 'Get Into Teaching' event on Wednesday 5th November 2025 at Spalding Academy to inspire future teachers. This is an fantastic opportunity for anyone who wants to work as a teacher at any of the schools in our Trust or in other secondary schools in Lincolnshire, Rutland and Peterborough. Our Trust are now one of the Lead Partners for Lincolnshire ITT and in September 2025, we opened a brand new Teaching School Hub at Spalding and already have 26 trainee teachers gaining their recognised teaching qualification with us.

In addition to this, we will also be holding a 'Become a Teaching Assistant' event on the same day at Spalding Academy. Becoming a Teaching Assistant is a highly rewarding and valued job at our Trust. Due to expansion, we are looking to recruit even more Teaching Assistants to join our SEN team. 
